Community Support Grant - *Community*

Ararat Rural City Council's Community Support Grants Program provides funding for projects and activities that build healthy and vibrant communities; sustain important community infrastructure and encourages community groups to work together to share and benefit from community resources.

What is a Community Support Grant - Community?

The Community Support grants - Community category, encourages and supports projects, programs and equipment which enhances health and wellbeing, sport and recreation and community safety initiatives.

How much funding is available?

Funding of up to \$1,000.00 as a one off grant is available for projects under the category of Community and do not require matching dollar for dollar funding contributions.

A project completion report which also confirms the final project budget matched the initial proposed budget during application will be required at the completion of the project.

Examples of activities that could be considered for funding include:

- Equipment purchase that would assist with the operation of a community group or organisation
- Community programs that encourage health and wellbeing
- Programs targeted at young people
- Promotional materials that promote your project or program
- Programs to promote active ageing activities
- Sporting and safety equipment

Requests for retrospective funding, recurrent operating costs or salary subsidies, ongoing funding from Council after the project is complete and routine/cyclical maintenance funding will not be considered.

How will my application be assessed?

Applicants must be 'not-for-profit' organisations or have a sponsoring body. The applicant must demonstrate that the project:

- Encourages community participation and co-operation





- Has positive health, social and environmental outcomes
- Is accessible to all people
- Is well planned and managed

What is the eligibility criteria for your organisation?

1. To operate within the Ararat Rural City municipality.
2. Be a "not for profit" organisation or have an auspice body prepared to apply on their behalf.
3. Operate for the benefit of the community and include direct benefits to the community.
4. Demonstrate financial viability and competence.
5. For facilities located on Council owned land or Crown land managed by Council the applicant must be a Section 86 Committee of Management.
6. For facilities not owned by Council the applicant must have written support from the land manager for the project.
7. Relevant to and or linked to Council Plan/s.

Examples of applications that are considered ineligible for funding include:

- Requests for retrospective funding (if a project has commenced it is deemed retrospective)
- Recurrent operating costs
- Salary subsidies
- Routine/cyclical maintenance funding
- Applications to purchase alcohol
